

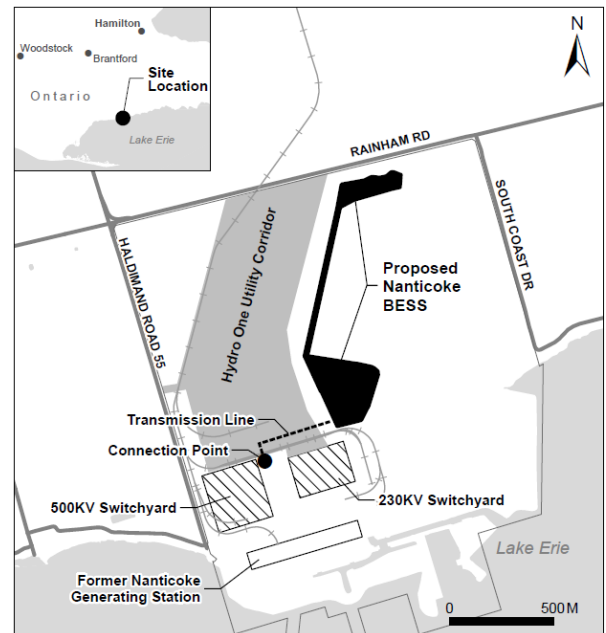
Invitation to a Public Information Centre

Nanticoke Battery Energy Storage System

To prepare for future electricity demands and support a reliable grid for Ontarians, the Independent Electricity System Operator has initiated a Long-Term Request for Proposals to secure new electricity resources that could be in service into the 2030s and beyond.

Atura Power, a subsidiary of Ontario Power Generation, is submitting a proposal as part of the Long-Term Request for Proposals to develop a new battery energy storage system facility in Haldimand County. The proposed Nanticoke Battery Energy Storage System is located north of the former Ontario Power Generation-owned and operated Nanticoke Generating Station between Haldimand Road 55 and South Coast Drive in Haldimand County.

Project Description

The proposed project will provide up to 300 megawatts of electricity storage and output for up to eight hours released back into the system when electricity demand is high. The project will include battery units and a system that will convert electrical alternative current to direct current for battery storage, as well as ancillary components such as transformers, emergency power, support buildings and transmission connection facilities.
